

Expectations:

Political Cartoon about the Missouri Compromise: Make sure your political cartoon is neatly drawn and colorful.

Diary Entry of an Immigrant Building the Erie Canal: One paragraph minimum, be sure to mention the type of labor the immigrant is performing, where the work is taking place, and the obstacles that he is facing.

Newspaper Article Discussing the Invention of the Steamboat: Two paragraph minimum, be sure to mention who invented the steamboat, how it was used, and how it changed trade and transportation.

Newspaper Article about the Monroe Doctrine: Two paragraph minimum, be sure to mention the reasons for the creation of the Monroe Doctrine, what it was, and how it changed the way the United States was viewed throughout the world.

Letter from Thomas Jefferson to a Friend about the Louisiana Purchase: Two paragraph minimum, be sure to include who was selling the Louisiana Territory, why Jefferson wanted to purchase the land, and the positive and negative outcomes of the purchase.

Diary Entry of Aaron Burr after Jefferson Won the Election of 1800: One paragraph minimum, be sure to include the election results, how the vote was decided, and how you think Aaron Burr felt after Jefferson was victorious.

Diary Entry of a Freed Slave: Two paragraph minimum, be sure to include how the slave became free, his or her experiences as a slave, and the obstacles he or she might face despite being free.

Political Cartoon about Sectionalism: Make sure your political cartoon is neatly drawn and colorful.

Advertisement for the Cotton Gin: Make sure you include a picture of the machine or cotton plants and that your advertisement discusses the benefits of using the cotton gin.
