## The Multiplication GaMe of Pig:

The object: to be the first to score 100 points or more.
How to play: Players take turns rolling two dice and following these rules:
I. A player rolls two dice and must multiply the two dice. That is their score. On a turn, a player may roll the dice as many times as he or she wants keeping a running total of the sums that come up. After each roll multiply the dice and add that to your rounds score.
2. But, if a l comes up on one of the dice before the player decides to stop rolling, the player scores $O$ for just that round and it's the next player's turn.

## What's My Factor?

You will need a deck of cards. Ace $=1$, jack $=11$, queen $=12$ and $\mathrm{king}=$ 13.

1. Two players each draw one card from the deck. Without looking at their cards, each player must place the card on his or her forehead, so that the other players can see the card's value.
2. The third, cardless player looks at the two cards on the others' foreheads and multiplies the cards' values together, saying, "The product of your two cards is $\qquad$ ."
3. Players 1 and 2 then try to figure out the card on their foreheads, alternating guesses.
4. The first player to figure out his or her card number wins 2 points. The other player gets a point when he or she figures out his or her number.

## Mulitplicaition war

Have your child play multiplication war with a deck of cards. Each person flips over two cards, and multiplies the two cards. You can have your child multiple both sets of cards. Whoever has the highest product keeps all four of the cards.
